ETSU EARLY CARE AND EDUCATION (NON-LICENSURE):

Early Care and Education (Non-licensure)

- Early Care and Education is a non-licensure program that leads to a Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood. Early Care and Education majors enjoy the option of working as an advocate for young children in various community positions, providing direct child care for young children in group settings, teacher assistants in public school settings and much more.
- Early Care and Education (Non-Licensure) cohort is a fully online cohort that allows students to take classes part-time or full-time. The cohort is based on a full time schedule for 2 years and a summer and will take longer if taken as a part-time program.
- All cohort students should complete the AAS degree at their community college to be eligible for the Early Care and Education online cohort.
- **Admission and Scholarships:**
 - Students should be admitted to ETSU early in the spring semester prior to the semester they plan to begin the cohort. Students interested in the Early Care and Education cohort must meet with the Cohort Advisor in the spring semester in order to be considered for the next fall cohort.

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The ETSU General Scholarship and College of Education Scholarship applications are due by March 1.
