The *Mildred Haun Conference: A Celebration of Appalachian Literature, Culture and Scholarship* explores and promotes classic and current topics for Appalachians and non-Appalachians. We are seeking individual and panel presentations from any of the following affiliations: faculty members, independent scholars, and community members, as well as graduate and undergraduate students who have an interest in Appalachian literature, culture, and scholarship.

We invite papers that consider, but are not limited to, the following broad areas of interest:

1. Conference theme: “But the Creek Did Rise: Heroism, Resiliency, and the Appalachian Spirit.”
2. Mildred Haun’s *The Hawk’s Done Gone* and other stories
3. Scholarship/critical essays, lectures, related to any of the following:
 - a. classic and contemporary Appalachian literature, including poetry, the novel, short fiction, nonfiction and film
 - b. multiculturalism in Appalachia
 - c. personal and cultural stories associated with Appalachia: explorations of folk medicine, agriculture, storytelling, history or crafts
 - d. treatment of stereotypes in Appalachian literature and popular culture
 - e. creative writing and publication; art or music projects/presentation
 - f. effective educational practices utilized in Appalachia
 - g. Practices, experiences, or research into healing during disaster management from 1st responders, medical personnel, STEM or environmental professionals, social workers, volunteers, or others w/experience.
